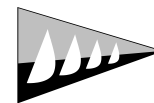

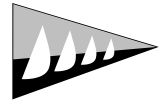

If you haven't signed up for the LifeSling Clinic there might still be room for you.

The clinic will be held at the Olympia Yacht Club beginning at 0900 on Saturday, June 15. It will begin with classroom instruction. Next, we will do dockside drills on the boats. Then, we will do actual rescues in Budd Inlet with volunteer victims in survival suits. Each participant will complete a rescue while in sole control of the boat, although under the watchful eye of an instructor. Depending on wind conditions, we usually finish in the mid to late afternoon.

The cost is just \$15 per person. The fee will be waived for skippers who bring two or more crew members.
